Methodology

Pew Research Center worked with PSB Insights to conduct 30 in-depth interviews with 15 men and 15 women who are raising children younger than 18 with a same-sex spouse or partner. The interviews were conducted online from Nov. 4 to Nov. 25, 2024.

Each interview lasted about one hour and was led by an experienced interviewer. Interviewers used a discussion guide that was developed by Pew Research Center in conjunction with PSB Insights and was reviewed by an Institutional Review Board. Participants were asked the same set of core questions, and occasionally the interviewers asked follow-up questions to understand their responses. The interviews were conducted over a secure online research platform with video and audio capabilities.

Participants were from 16 states representing all four regions of the United States: Northeast, South, Midwest and West. They ranged in age from mid-20s to mid-60s, and we heard from a mix of White, Black, Hispanic, Asian and multiracial participants. Almost all of the participants were married; some were living with their partner but not married.

Participants were recruited by RRU Global through targeted email outreach among their panel of qualified candidates and through connections with potential participants through LGBTQ networks and LGBTQ parent groups via social media. All participants were paid for their time.

Participants had to meet the following criteria to be eligible: they are 18 years of age or older, identify as LGBTQ and are married to or living with a same-sex spouse or partner, and they are jointly raising a child age 17 or younger living in their household at least 50% of the time. They also had to have access to the internet and a device with a working webcam. Transgender adults were eligible to participate if they have a same-sex spouse or partner and children under age 18. The final sample did not include any transgender participants.

In order to ensure a diverse mix of participants among all who qualified, the research team also collected demographic information such as household income, education level, rurality, ethnicity and race.



Analysis

Center researchers reviewed the audio recordings and transcripts of each interview, creating a coding scheme based on the content to help identify key quotations and themes for inclusion in this essay. After the coding scheme was established, three researchers coded a selection of transcripts independently, then discussed the application of codes in each interview to ensure that the coding scheme covered all key themes and was being used similarly across researchers. The coding scheme was modified and refined for accuracy and clarity. The remaining transcripts were then divided among the researchers and coded independently.

After all transcripts were coded, codes were reviewed to determine larger themes and coverage for each topic. Some codes and quotations are not included due to infrequency and to preserve anonymity. Quotations that best represented the common themes were selected to feature in the essay.

Some quotes have been lightly edited for clarity, brevity or to remove identifying details. In this essay, participants are identified as mothers and fathers with a same-sex spouse or partner based on their answers to the screening questionnaire. These words don't necessarily encompass all of the ways in which participants described themselves. Participants' ages are grouped into the following categories to better preserve their anonymity: 20s, 30s, 40s, and ages 50 and older.

The findings are not statistically representative and cannot be extrapolated to wider populations.
