## Appendix A: Parties we asked about

In each of the 24 countries surveyed, we asked about at least two parties: the main governing party and the main opposition party.

- The main **governing party** is the party within the governing coalition (if applicable) that held the most seats during the survey period.
- The main opposition party is the largest party by seat share outside the governing coalition during the survey period.

In some countries, elections took place during or after the survey period. The governing and opposition parties in our analysis reflect the those that were *in power at the time the survey was conducted*. For instance, the Germany survey took place after the nation's general elections, but the incumbent Social Democratic Party (SPD) remained in power until a new governing coalition was formed; this took place after the survey concluded. So, for the purposes of our analysis, SPD is considered the governing party.

Because of space constraints on our questionnaire, we are not able to ask about all parties in a given country. But we tried to ask about the largest parties and those that have recently been in government or are emerging as politically consequential, based on conversations with experts and with our local vendors.

We asked about at least one right-wing populist party in every European country surveyed (for more information, refer to Appendix B). In some of these countries, we also asked about left-wing or centrist populist parties.

The following table lists the parties asked about in each country and whether it was categorized as governing, opposition or neither:
